Recent anthropological research has witnessed an increased interest in phenomenological investigations of religious and spiritual healing, with a focus on lived experiences as grounding the reality of spirit worlds and the emergence of healing processes.

In particular, ideas of affects and feelings as preconscious lived intensities emerging through and situated in practices and interactions with the environment has become central in investigations of religious and spiritual experiences also beyond processes of healing proper.

Despite long-standing anthropological traditions shedding light on the technological aspect of spiritual and religious practices - notably rituals - and on their capacity to (re)make worlds, to offer ways of coping with uncertainty and to lead to wellbeing, the phenomenological dynamics of such processes have been surprisingly under-investigated. Some anthropologists, including Diana Espírito Santo, have advocated for a focus on ritualized interactions as contributing to the emergence of socialized feelings that become the evidence of spirit presence and the ground for the social life of spirits. Namely, they argued in favour of investigating rituals as technologies that elicit specific feelings.

The present workshop aims at contributing to such debate, by exploring the potential of an investigation of the role of 'affective technologies' in relation to religious and spiritual healing. By analyzing different practices and technologies that elicit affects in the field, it aims at elaborating a processual approach that sheds light on how spirit realities and spirit worlds emerge, and how they potentially contribute to healing processes.

The Workshop will be in person only, with the exception of the Book Launch for Pierini, E., Groisman, A., and D. Espírito Santo (eds.). 2023. Other Worlds, Other Bodies: Embodied Epistemologies and Ethnographies of Healing, which will be held both in person and online.
